FREAK TREE DESCRIBED

FOUR-L BULLETIN FEATURES LOG FOUND AT MILL

(Register Lane County Special) SPRINGFIELD, Ore., Dec. 8.—A freak tree in which one tree is surrounded by another is described in the December issue of the Four-L Bulletin received here today. The log was found at a mill here and a cut sent to Portland for examination. Photographic reproductions of the log are printed in the Bulletin.

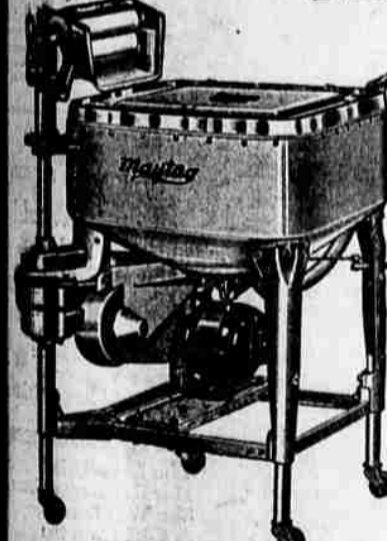

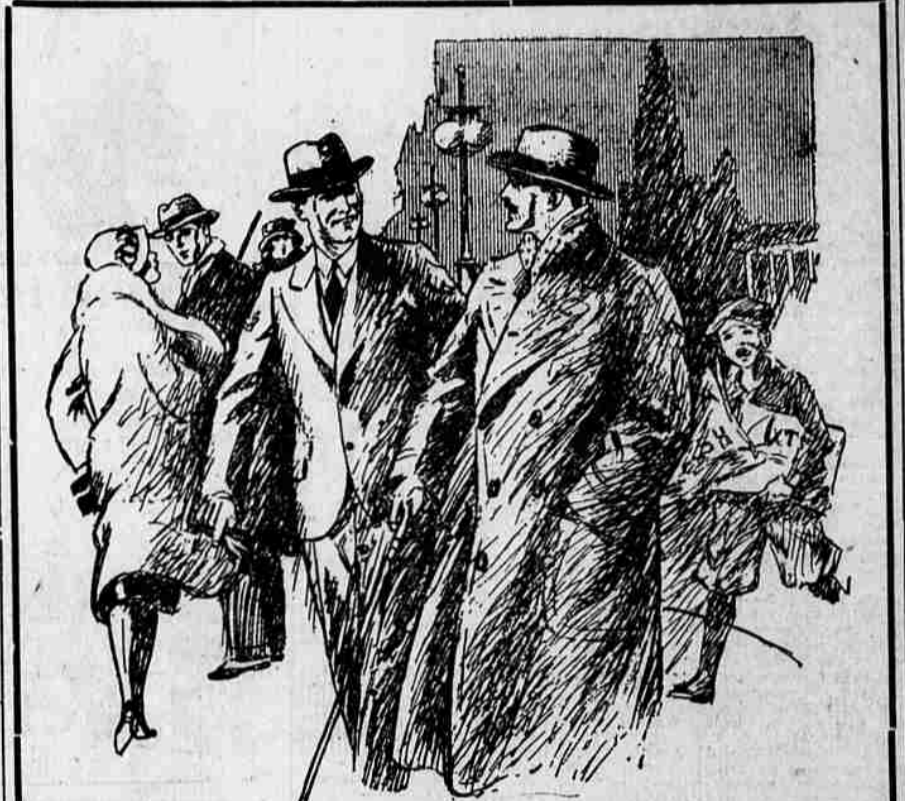
