At 10 o'clock in the morning to the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon, and at said election, the following proposed charter amendments will be submitted to the electors of said city, referred by the Common Council for their approval or rejection, to-wit:

1. An act to amend the City Charter of the City of Eugene, Oregon, by amending Section 57, of Chapter IX of said Charter by adding thereto an authorization to the Common Council of the City to re-assess costs for sewer, street, alley and other improvements, when the former assessment has been declared invalid, or the Council shall be in doubt as to its validity, or shall deem it necessary, and to make the same a lien upon the property abutting upon, adjacent to or benefited by said improvement.

2. An act to amend the Charter of the City of Eugene, Oregon, by adding a new chapter thereto, authorizing and empowering the Common Council and all negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene, in the sum of One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the purpose of refunding the outstanding General Fund Warrants and standing Bond Interest Fund Warrants of the City, and to expend the proceeds in retiring the outstanding General Fund Warrants.

The Common Council by said Ordinance No. 1518, has fixed the polling places to be one in each ward of said city as follows:

In Ward One, which is the territory south of Eleventh Avenue and East of Willamette Street, the polling place shall be in the basement of the public library of Eugene.

In Ward Two, which is the territory north of Eleventh Avenue and East of Willamette Street, the polling place shall be in the Eugene Army building.

In Ward Three, which is the territory north of Seventh Avenue and west of Willamette Street, the polling place shall be in the Hampton Building of Eugene, at the corner of Sixth and Willamette Streets.

In Ward Four, which is the territory south of Seventh Avenue and west of Willamette Street, the polling place shall be in the lobby of the City Hall.
