## GRAIN PRICES REPORTED

Farmers Laying By Reserve For Future Use

## EDFORD TRADE GOOD

Grain Reports 50 Per Cent of Wheat Crop Still Held by Producer With Price Now on Increase

## PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 11.

The Northwest is better equipped agriculturally and industrially than for several years, according to the annual survey completed today by the Lumbermen's association sent to banks in Washington and Oregon this institution has received several hundred replies which give an accurate composite picture of the Northwest situation, especially in the agricultural field. The entire tone of the report is one of optimism and a prediction to liquidate a large portion of their indebtedness which has been possible during the past three years. In the agricultural field, prices have risen and the farmers are permitted to operate more profitably than in any other year in their history.
