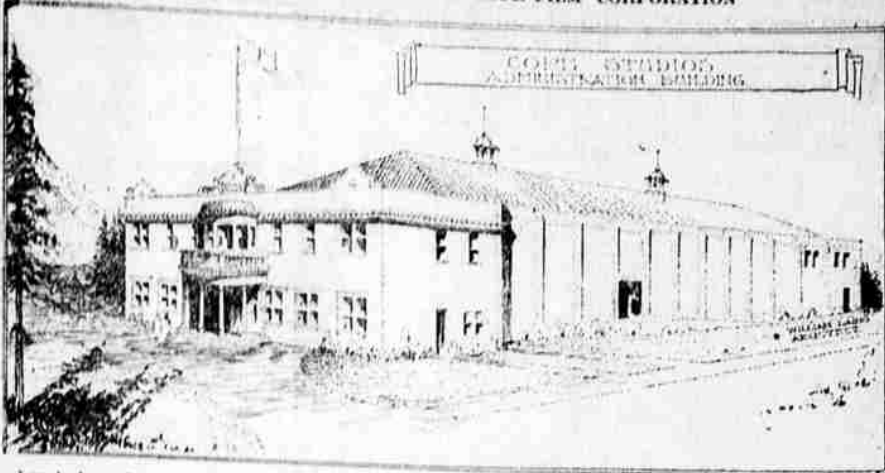


ADMINISTRATION BUILDING OF THE COPE FILM CORPORATION

Rev. Frank Fay Eddy of the Unitarian church said that his work here has been satisfactory, but not spectacular. "We have had a 100 per cent increase in attendance since we came. Thirty per cent of our congregation are students; 75 per cent are men. It is the more thoughtful students that come to us, and as men are generally more interested in thinking things out than women there is the greater percentage of men."

Free Pulpit Draws. "A perfectly free pulpit and a freedom of thinking throughout the church is what draws our people. I never attempt to control my conversation in any way, and I do not wish the congregation to do so. We are the only church in town that absolutely sponsors freedom of thought and speech."

Membership Drive On. "This year has been one of membership driving for us. I came here

to do special work in membership. We have received 101 into the church since January and are sure of 25 more this year. We are aiming at a 100 per cent increase in membership, and we will accomplish it.

"This church has a definite unified, religious outlook, and character. It is the only one in the city definitely liberal evangelical. We believe in a free pulpit, and freedom in our theology. Most churches are divided into two factions: liberal and fundamental.

"We aim to make our church rather a university one where members of the faculty and students versed in scholarship of the present time may come without having their scientific ideas interfered with," Mr. Clark concluded.
