### MILLS CLOSING DOWN

#### ANNUAL HOLIDAY SUSPENSION HAS BEGUN

Large Number of Companies Will Resume Cutting January 4, Says A. I. Letter

The holiday suspension of the fir lumber industry started in earnest Saturday night when several large sawmills were closed, according to the A. I. employment letter received here yesterday. A large number of companies have announced that they will resume cutting January 4. Practically all mills and camps will be down from December 24 to 28.

Many mills which at this time will be closed only for the week-end will later be shut down for repair and overhauling, and the shut-down for the lumber industry as a whole will amount to a suspension of two weeks, according to the letter.
