Bond Interest and Sinking Fund Is Provided

ONE SALARY IS RAISED

Street Commissioner Gets \$150 Instead of \$140; Dump tender Provided for

More than \$10,000 was added to the city budget for 1926 at the meeting of the budget committee last night at the city hall before it was finally adopted.

Before the budget came up for passage the committee voted to give the street commissioner a salary of \$150 a month instead of \$140 and made provision to pay the dump tender \$40 a month.

The committee made an allowance for interest on the \$175,000 refunding warrants just voted, also \$5000 for a sinking fund for this issue.
