

### COACHES' ASSOCIATION FAVORS PRESENT RULES

#### Play Basis Discussed But Voted Down

(By The Associated Press)  
NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—Members of the American football coaches' association went on record today as favoring the present football rules and voted not to recommend any change.

Several changes were discussed, including one to put a game on a play instead of time basis and the elimination of the intentional safety, but in the end the coaches agreed that the game could not be changed to advantage.

Four resolutions recommended by the trustees were adopted without much discussion as follows: That a committee be appointed to stabilize the profession of football coaching.

That any person actively engaged in any capacity with professional football after September 1, 1926, shall be ineligible for membership in the American football coaches' association.

That members of this association shall not select any all-star or all-American teams for any agent or agency.

That practice during the playing season be confined to two hours daily and that coaches shall not call their squads together before September 15, unless college opens prior to that date.

That this resolution be adopted by the vote of the meeting and to be carried out as far as coaches have authority.

Gilmore Doble of Cornell was elected president and Dr. J. W. F. Zupke of Illinois, William H. Cowell of New Hampshire university was elected first vice president and W. W. Roper of Princeton, second vice president and Dr. J. W. Wilce of Ohio State, secretary and treasurer. It is understood that the president of the Pacific Coast Coaches' association shall automatically become the third vice president.

Edward K. Hall, chairman of the rules committee, in an address, condemned the practice of scouting, coaching from the side lines and proscribing as contributing factors toward over emphasis of intercollegiate football. He also denounced the all-American idea.

Ralph Hand, favorite Eugene wrestler, who meets Bob Kruse of Portland in the main event of a card at the Hellig Wednesday night is fast nearing the top in professional wrestling circles. Hand has not lost a match since he entered the professional ranks. It is stated, however, when he meets Kruse he will tackle one of the hardest opponents he ever grappled with. Kruse is rated as nearly the equal of Ted Thyse and Mike Yckett of Portland. The winner of the match here will probably be matched with one of these two in a forthcoming card here. It is announced.

With this prospective match in view both men will do their utmost to make a good showing possible. This will make the bout here one of the most important on the coast.

Ted Brown, who wrestles Wildcat Pete, in the preliminary has been training in Portland for the past month in anticipation of his match here. It was learned yesterday, Brown is to be battled with Robin Reed for 40 minutes recently. The winner of this bout will probably get a match with Reed for his inter-mountain title soon. It is stated.
