## SUMMIT IS NOT REACHED

**PARTY WITHIN 300 FEET OF  
TOP OF SISTER**  
"Mushroom" Ice Makes Going Too  
Dangerous to Ascend  
Clear to Top

Five Eugene men—L. C. Paget, Alfred Skei, Wayne Reed, Glenn Resenete and Ed Thurston—climbed to within 300 feet of the top of the Middle Sister, just week-end and were prevented from reaching the top only by "mushroom" ice which made the going too dangerous to be risked fur-

ther. These ice formations, they say, resembled huge mushrooms growing up from the surface of the icy snow, and they were constantly breaking off and rolling down the mountain.

The party left Eugene Saturday morning and camped that night in two feet of snow at the head of White Branch. They left camp at 2 o'clock the next morning and arrived within 300 feet of the summit at 1:30 in the afternoon. Much of the snow encountered, they say, was hard packed and frozen, and for two and a half miles they had to cut steps in the ice in order to proceed.

They went in by way of Frog Camp and the Skyline trail, using skis from where they left their car to the base of the last hard climb where the snow became too

icy. Thanks to the skis, the return trip was made quickly.

Wayne Reed and Ed Thurston were the first to climb the Sister last spring, and they claim the record of having been the last to make the ascent this year.
