ROAD PETITION IS OUT

JASPER RESIDENTS SEEK TO ELIMINATE CROSSINGS

Many Springfield People Sign Names to Document; Road May Run Between River and Tracks

(Register Lane County Special) SPRINGFIELD, Ore., Jan. 15.—A petition to the county court for the changing of the county road at Jacoby point...

The proposed change in the route would place it between the river and Southern Pacific railway tracks instead of crossing and recrossing the tracks as at present.

The road makes a sharp curve at Jacoby point and crosses the railroad abruptly after paralleling it for a long distance.

A change in the route will have to be made in a short time, it is stated. The Southern Pacific company is now excavating along the right of way to eliminate slides from blocking the tracks when regular train service is established.

This excavation will undermine the present county road and necessitate repair. By changing the route now, needless expense will be saved, the petitioners point out.
