FARMERS TO PLANT FLAX MEETING AT HARRISBURG IS HELD BY GROWERS

Oil Company Representative at Gathering Outlines Terms of Contract Offered HARRISBURG, Ore., March 12.—(Special to the Register.)—Those in this vicinity who are interested in the flax industry attended a meeting at the Rialto Wednesday afternoon, promoted by the Portland Linsseed Oil company and the extension service of O. A. C.

Professor Wm. L. Teutsch represented O. A. C. and E. H. Smith the Portland company. Mr. Smith explained the company's contract and Teutsch discussed phases of flax and its culture. The oil company guarantees \$2.52 per bushel and offers 40 pounds of seed for one bushel of the seed grown from to be sown in 1927 the Duluth, Minn., cash price is guaranteed for the 1927 crop. It is reported that 14 farmers here will grow flax this season under the contract.

The O. A. C. man pointed out at this price the flax should bring from \$5 to \$10 more per acre than spring oats, therefore it is valuable spring crop and substitute for early oats. Two local farmers grow flax here last year with good success. One of these, O. E. H. Smith, reported a yield of more than 1000 pounds per acre, and had with him a sample of flax fibre which was taken to O. A. C. for analysis. This year, E. H. Smith and R. K. Burton one, it was stated that the Burton vicinity signed up for about 150 acres.

RIGHTS ASKED FOR DEBS

CITIZENSHIP WANTED FOR SOCIALIST LEADER

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 12.—A movement has been started to have citizenship rights restored to Eugene V. Debs, socialist leader who served more than two years in the Atlanta penitentiary for opposing American participation in the world war. Representative Berger, Socialist, Wisconsin, after a conference today at the White House, said President Coolidge has shown sympathetic interest in an appeal for Debs. Tomorrow Berger plans to discuss the question of amnesty with department of justice officials. One of the stumbling blocks to restoration of citizenship rights is Debs' refusal to make a personal application for a full pardon. He adheres to the belief, expressed during his trial when he refused to employ counsel, that he committed no crime in voicing his opposition to war in his famous Canton, Ohio, speech. The main object of Mr. Berger's visit to the department of justice will be to determine whether some one else can initiate a pardon application. When the prison sentence of Debs, who was four times a candidate for president on the Socialist ticket, was commuted by President Harding, his citizenship rights were not restored. He is now 74 years old, living at Terre Haute, Ind.

Road Income Small (By The Associated Press) SALEM, Ore., March 12.—The Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railroad company, for operations in Oregon, shows a net income of only \$749.98 for operations in 1925, according to its annual report to the public service commission. Operating revenue was \$187,958.55 and operating expenses \$187,098.57. The gross income was \$17,218.82. The company started the year with a deficit of \$10,433.22. Tompkins Attention!
