LEVY ORDERS ARE SIGNED

TAX MEASURES WILL GO ON MAY ELECTION BALLOT

Four Mills for Bonds and One for Fair Buildings; McKenzie and Coast Projects to Get Funds

The Lane county court yesterday made orders to place a four-mill road tax levy measure and a

one-mill levy, to provide buildings at the county fair grounds, on the ballot at the May election. The four-mill road levy is intended to raise funds for the county's share of construction on the McKenzie highway and the Wilamette valley-Florence highway, two mills being planned for each project. It is estimated that \$168,000 will be raised by the four-mill levy if it is approved by the voters and the amount to be raised by the one-mill levy for the fair grounds is \$42,000. The four-mill highway levy has

been planned for some time past and if it carries the state and county promise that construction will be started as soon as possible this year. The one-mill levy measure for the fair buildings will be put on the ballot at the request of officers of the fair association who state that it is quite necessary to have new buildings to accommodate the rapidly increasing exhibits.
