

AMELIA EARHART BACK AS NEW YORKERS CHEER

Woman Flier Returns Home After Adventure

MANY EVENTS PLANNED

Birdsman's Family Did Not Come to New York to Meet Her, But Wait in Boston

NEW YORK, July 6.—(AP)—Miss Amelia Earhart, first woman to fly across the Atlantic and two male members of the crew of the monoplane Friendship, were home today to receive the plaudits of their countrymen.

Aboard the United States liner President Roosevelt the fliers spent the night off quarantine as the ship awaited the change in tide to proceed up the harbor.

All the fanfare that attended the return of other trans-Atlantic fliers awaited them—a trip up the bay on the municipal tug Macon with Grover Whalen, and the mayor's committee of welcome, landing at the battery while harbor sirens welcome, a ride up Broadway to city hall for a formal welcome and then a motorcycle-escorted dash up town to the hotel Biltmore.

Wait in Boston
Wilmer Stultz and Lou Gordon, pilot and mechanic, respectively, had a private welcome awaiting. Mrs. Stultz and Miss Anne Bruce, of Brookline, Mass., fiancée of Gordon, arranged to be the first to greet the two airmen. Miss Earhart's family did not come to New York to greet her, preferring to wait for her arrival in Boston Monday.

The three fliers are to be guests of Commander Richard E. Byrd at luncheon. Sir George White, Clarence Chamberlin, Bert Balchen and other noted fliers will greet them there.

This afternoon Miss Earhart will greet a delegation of Camp Fire Girls and to the girls, Stultz and Gordon are to join other celebrities at an Olympic fund benefit at the Palace theatre.

Official delegations from Boston and Chicago were here to join in today's ceremonies and tender official invitations.

Gordon May Marry
Gordon's fiancée is ready to marry him right away if he says the word. He called her by telephone from England and asked her if she would marry him immediately after his return. She said "yes," but now would prefer to wait until they could be married at Brookline. That all depends on "Slim" though, she said, as "of course, he's the pilot of our plane."

TIMBER TAXING PROBED

YALE MAN COMES TO OREGON FOR RESEARCH

SALEM, Ore., July 5.—(AP)—Professor Fred R. Fairchild of Yale university and a force of eight assistants will arrive in Oregon, July 14 to begin an investigation under the Clarke-McNary reforestation act for the section of the Pacific Northwest forest experiment station, the federal forest service and the state department of forestry.

It is estimated that two years will be required for a full investigation in the northwest and the Fairchild report when completed will be made available to the state. Upon his arrival in Portland, July 14 Professor Fairchild will confer with officials of the Pacific Northwest forest experiment station, the federal forest service and the state department of forestry.

Portland will be headquarters of the group, but the county seats of the several timber counties will be visited from time to time. It is expected that a general state reforestation tax scheme will result from the probe.

COMMITTEES FROM EAST TO MEET HOOVER TODAY

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 5.—(AP)—Conferences with both eastern and western party leaders for the purpose of establishing divisional campaign organizations occupy prominent places on Secretary Hoover's program for the days remaining before his departure from Washington.

Members of the Republican national committee from the western states are to meet with the nominee next week, while tomorrow the eastern committeemen will come to the capital to discuss the situation in their section.

Under present plans, divisional headquarters will be established in Chicago and New York, with a central office here. Eastern and western campaign managers are to be selected at the two conferences.
