This automatically has killed pennant hopes in the other seven cities. When hope is gone, interest in what a team does—or doesn't do—lessens so noticeably, in such cities, that the turntables grow rusty from disuse.  
What's going to be done about it?  
Nothing—just that!

Ruppert isn't going to call off his dogs of war. If his team won every game from now on he'd be the happiest man in the world. Of course, Jake would be aware of the distress such a happening would bring to the other clubs but he reckons that its reality of no concern to him.

"I'm out to win—so are they," is his viewpoint. "If my club beats them—well, that's why I sent 'em into battle. I'm operating only one club—not a league—and if my team outlasts opposition I'm proud of my team."

So there you are.  
Jake decided he needed some newer players—youthsters with pep, fire and brilliancy to replace fading veterans. So once more he drew a few million shekels from out of the family sugar bowl and went "shopping." When he finished the Yankees had new new cogs replacing the old and worn ones. It was a rebuilt machine with plenty of power.

"Now let 'em boys," said Jake. And they did.  
Can't Stop 'em Now  
The Yankees won the 1926 flag. They made a runaway race of it in 1927 and nothing short of an earthquake.
