STOCK TREND IS DOWN
 ATTEMPTS TO RALLY FAIL DURING DAY
 U. S. Common, General Electric and Other Favorites, Show Resistance
 NEW YORK, July 12.—(AP)—The line of least resistance in today's stock market was again downward.
 Marking up of the call money rate from the renewal figure of 7 to 8 per cent brought a flood of offerings into the market, sending many issues down one to 12 points, several attempts being made during the course of the day to rally the general list, but most of them fell flat, although United States common, General Electric and a few other industrial favorites showed stubborn resistance to selling pressure.
 General Motors again bore the brunt of the selling pressure, closing six points lower at 148 1/2, after having fluctuated between 152 1/2 and 151 on total sales of nearly half a million shares.
 National Leather broke 12 points, Adams Express and American Linseed preferred 10 each, and American Bank Note, Case Threshing, DuPont, Kelly-Springfield, 8 per cent preferred, Rockwell Insurance and Wright Aeronautical, five to eight points.
 Radio sold down to 162 1-8 and rallied to 165 1/4 up 1 1/4. American Tobacco issues ran up four points on talk of a two for one stock split-up. Manhattan Electric Supply recorded a similar gain.
 United States Steel common met good support throughout the session, closing fractionally higher at 135.
 Except for a break of seven points in Nickel Plate common and five points in Lehigh Valley, most of the rails received fairly good support.
