SPECIALTIES TAKE JUMP
 STEEL PRICES ATTRACT BUYING DUE TO ADVANCE
 NEW YORK, July 20—(AP)—Spirited advances in a few pool specialties, some of which reached new high ground, enlivened an otherwise dull and colorless stock market today.
 Steel shares attracted buying support as a result of recent enlivening trade advances. U. S. Steel common, Vanadium, Republic and Transue and Williams all closed a point or more higher. Colorado Fuel failed to maintain its early gain.
 Motors were mixed. Hudson held fairly steady on the publication of the report which showed earnings in the second quarter slightly less than those in the corresponding period a year ago.
 General Motors closed fractionally lower at 137 3/8 after having touched 139 1/2. Hupp advanced 1 1/2. Union Carbide also was heavily bought, closing 7 points higher at 156 3/4. McCrory Stores common and the B stock and Montgomery Ward were pushed into new high ground. The sharp advance in Eastman Kodak was based on unfounded rumors that the company had developed a color film suitable for use in amateur motion picture cameras.
 A few weak spots also cropped out. New low prices for the year, or longer, were registered by Artisan Corporation, Pan American Western, Penn-Dixie Cement, General Electric, United Glass Stores, Chicago Yellow Cab and Hollander & Sons. Kelvanator was heavily sold on rumors of disappointing earnings.
