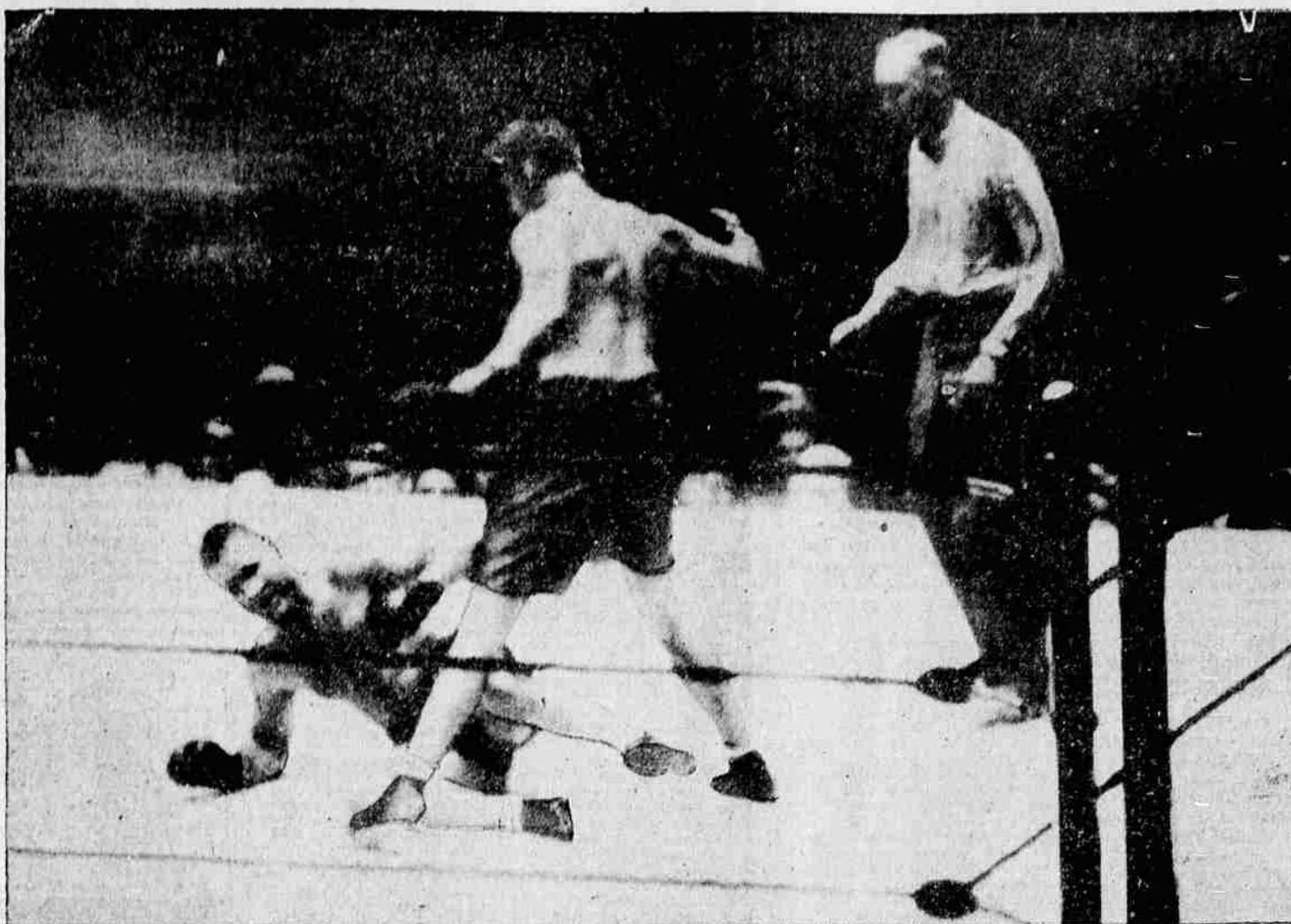


TOM HEENEY SMACKS THE CANVAS IN HIS FIGHT WITH GENE TUNNEY
