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AUSTRIA REGAINS FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE AND STANDING

VIENNA, July 31.—(AP)—Austria, with the acquisition of financial independence, has at the same time regained her former commercial responsibility and standing.

When, six years ago, we obtained our first international loan, the so-called "League of Nations Loan" our own security did not suffice our creditors. A whole string of states had to stand surety for us. Nobody asks this of us today. Our own pledges for the League's loan have proved themselves as completely adequate that they can be accepted easily as cover for new loans also. This fact demonstrates the great progress we have achieved.

We have obtained this favorable result by consistent adherence since 1920 to bourgeois economic principles; that is to say, non-socialistic principles. During all this time we have had bourgeois governments, despite a large Socialist minority in the population. Since 1922, barring a period of less than two years, I headed these governments myself.

Coalition not Advisable
We are some times asked why we do not form a coalition with the labor party. I maintain that a bourgeois system of government is absolutely indispensable for our consolidation. Immediately after the Austrian collapse we had a Bourgeois-Socialistic coalition, which at that time undeniably was in accordance with political prudence and in some respects proved useful. It was useful as a first emergency dam to stave off the wave of destructive propaganda sweeping in from the east. But for positive reconstructive work the dam proved too weak.

In order to overcome the chaos and to re-establish our little world anew, those parties had to assume the enormous task of reconstructing the shattered economy. It was upon themselves and to withstand the exaggerated demands of the masses even of their own political party. The beginning was laborious and brought setbacks. Then came the critical period when our currency was falling into the bottomless pit, and the act that was to rescue us was demanded of me from the right and from the left.

League Loan Timely
It was then that in the name of Austria I proposed the question that was to decide our destiny. In more perceive a manifestation of the answer I received. I could once international solidarity. I need not dwell on the success of the material restoration which was inaugurated.

Eugene claims the ball hit him intentionally and if their claim is upheld the last inning and part of the eighth will be played over again. The tilt will be taken up in the eighth inning with two out and none on bases for Salem and Eugene leading 3 to 2.

The Eugene team played good ball Sunday. Fuller struck out 13 batters and Dutton, left fielder, made a home run.
