Has Good Talent

The Bend roster includes a set of names that savors of salaries and high class semi-pro ball. Seven of the players on the Bend aggregation have played in organized ball circuits, while the other two are the best Bend could offer in the way of local talent.

The Bend team is at the head of the league standing list, just as it was when it came here before and lost to Eugene.

The Bend aggregation is one of the fastest semi-pro nines in this section of the country, and wherever it plays, the stands have been packed to see the colorful team in action. That Eugene has proven the strongest rival of the Eagles in previous encounters this season goes to show that the Eugene team should be up in the running when the season nears a close.
