At best, a president's vacation is
a trying affair. It is crowded with
visitors, business, interviews, re-
porters, photographers. Privacy is
an impossibility, if one is to judge
from the mass of newspaper copy
which comes out of the summer
white house describing nearly ev-
ery act of the vacationing executive.

But in the beautiful Brule river
country of Wisconsin, Calvin Cool-
idge this summer is probably en-
joying one of the best vacations of
his life. True enough, so much ac-
tivity about him on his vacation
would probably drive the average
citizen to distraction, but Calvin
Coolidge has experienced five such
vacations, and probably has learned
how to enjoy them.

On this particular vacation, the
situation is such that President
Coolidge is able to enjoy at least a
little more than the usual freedom
from public notice allowed a vaca-
tioning president. The spotlight of
public interest is turned, not on
President Coolidge, but on the two
men who hope to succeed him in
office. As a result, the president
can at least flick a fly from his
nose without having a reporter
flash the word to an eager public.

Mr. Coolidge, too, is not weighed
down so heavily with political re-
sponsibilities as he has been in past
vacations. The responsibility of
carrying the weight of Republican
leadership is being shifted to the
able shoulders of Herbert Hoover,
and we doubt not that Mr. Coolidge
issues private sighs of relief as the
process goes forward. There un-
doubtedly is plenty of business to
be attended to, with his adminis-
tration now winding toward its close,
but one can accomplish a lot of
work happily with the prospect of
relief from it in sight.
