SHAVES IMPARTIALLY

NEGRO BARBER SERVES BOTH CURTIS AND ROBINSON

Called Upon to Declare Political Faith, He Evades Issue

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—(AP)—Neutrality is the discreet position maintained by John Sims, who must shave two vice presidential candidates impartially.

John, 37-year-old negro barber, who has been shaving and trimming Senators Robinson and Curtis, Democratic and Republican nominees for vice president, for many years, but never was he called upon to declare his political faith until both clients came in on the same day to occupy his chair.

Senator Robinson asked the veteran barber pointedly where his vote would be cast in the November election, as if to intimate that a Republican barber might not hope to retain the patronage of a Democratic candidate for high office.

"Oh, k'way, don't ask me that!" countered Sims—and then, happily, "But no resident of Washington can vote anyway, so what difference does it make whether I'd vote for you or Senator Curtis?"

Robinson conceded the point and left with a neat haircut.

Sims has been a barber on the senate side of the capitol since 1892, when he deserted his profession of preaching deacon to enter government service. He has adhered to the precepts of his youth, however, to the extent of contributing a scriptural commentary with every tonsorial task he performs.

JAPAN WARNS PROVINCE

TELLS MANCHURIA NOT TO JOIN NATIONALISTS

TOKYO, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Alarmed by reports that Manchuria was about to be joined to the Chinese Nationalist government at Nanking, Japan today warned the province not to take that step and told Nanking that "suitable measures" would be initiated unless the Nationalists recede from their attitude toward the special rights of Japanese citizens in China.

Baron Tanaka, prime minister, told today's cabinet meeting that he had reliable information that Chang Hsueh-Liang, military governor of Manchuria, and Chiang Kai-Shek, Nationalist military commander in chief, have worked out the draft of an agreement to extend the Nanking way into Manchuria.

MADE PLEA FOR HASTE

Messages to Rescuers Told of Poison Gases in Hull

SENDER EXPIRES AT KEY

Death Overtakes Italian Crew as They Try to Communicate Their Last Thoughts

POLA, Italy, Aug. 9.—(AP)—The dramatic messages exchanged between the men imprisoned in the submarine F-14 and the rescuers were made public today. Both by the submarine telegraph and in notes they showed that death overtook the imprisoned men while they were still trying to communicate their last thoughts.

The first message received from the submarine, immediately after the sinking, said:

"We have six dead in poop. We are standing with the poop sunk in the mud. The position of the submarine is almost vertical."

After the vessel was raised it was found that only four had died by drowning, the difference being explained by the fact that two other men were imprisoned in the last compartment of the stern, while the captain and others of the crew were in the poop.

Search began immediately but it was unsuccessful until airplanes arrived. The rescuers immediately sent this message:

Cheering Message Sent
"Be of good cheer. We have found you. Divers are descending." To this the submarine replied: "Morale on board is highest, but poison gases are beginning to form. We plead for haste."

The destroyer Aquila then steamed over the wreck, dragging a heavy anchor hawser. This brought the following message from below: "We feel a heavy body passing over the hull."

Divers immediately descended and in a few minutes had fixed an air tube through which fresh air was started into the submarine. The rescuers then messaged:

"Courage. We are sending you air. How are you feeling?" The reply was that poison gases were still being felt and that no benefit had resulted from the air tube. This message ended: "Be quick."

At 11 p. m. Monday night the submarine said:

"We are lost."

Message Not Finished

A few minutes later its sounder was again heard, saying: "Gas is advancing inexorably. We are dying. Long live—"

The message was unfinished and the explanation came when the operator was discovered with his hand still on the key of his instrument.

Captain Well, it was found, had scribbled a few words with pencil in a note book. They read: "We are waiting. We hope."

Lower down on the page were the words:

"Poor mother. Be strong like mothers of—"

This sentence also was unfinished death having overtaken the captain before he could complete it.

MINE RULES SAVE LIVES

WORKINGS CLEARED OF MEN BEFORE SHOT SET OFF

PRICE, Utah, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Safety regulations established after a blast four years ago which cost 172 lives were credited with having prevented another disaster today when an explosion rocked the Utah Fuel company's coal mine at Castle Gate.

One of the safety rules provided that the mine be cleared of all men before "shots" were set off to loosen the ore. Early this morning, before the mine's crew of 125 men had gone on duty, three fire bosses set off a "shot" from the surface, in accordance with the safety rules.

It was followed immediately by a terrific blast that hurled debris from the mouth of the tunnel. The explosion was almost an exact duplication of the fatal blast four years ago, which trapped 172 workers in the mine, none of whom escaped with their lives.

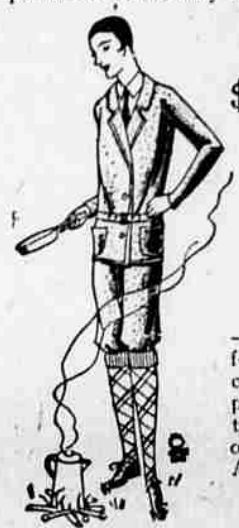

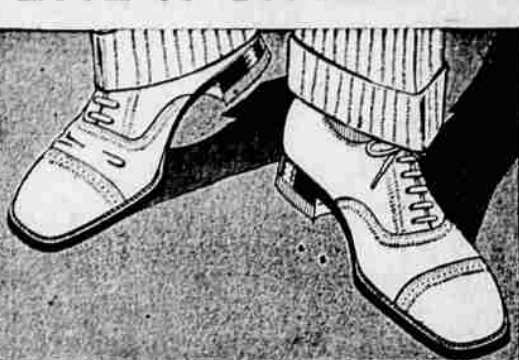
