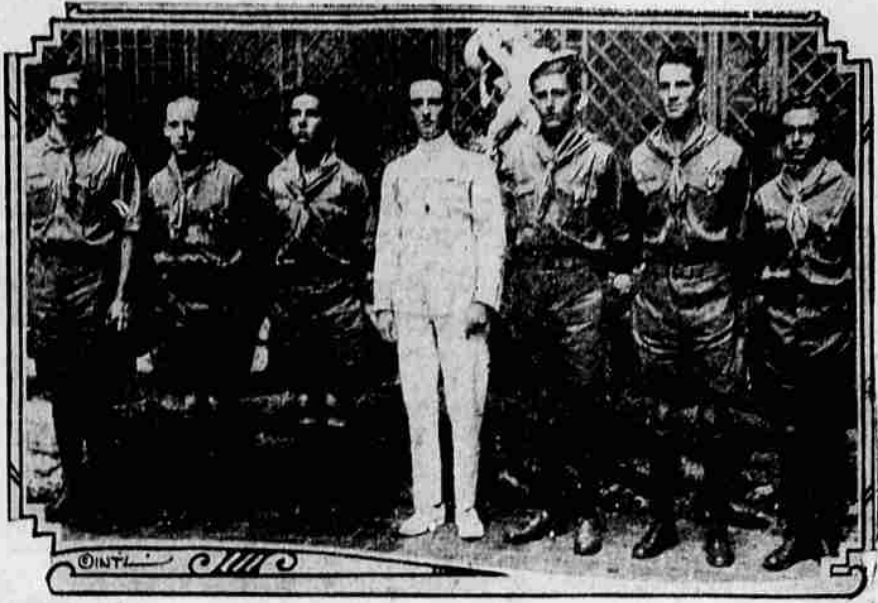

HAS 5,568 PLURALITY OVER NEAREST OPPONENT

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 15.—(AP)—Myers Y. Cooper, Cincinnati had an unofficial plurality of 5,568 over his nearest opponent, James T. Hogg of Sandusky, for the Republican gubernatorial nomination when complete returns from yesterday's primary election were tabulated by the Associated Press tonight.

The unofficial vote stood: Cooper 25,728; Hogg 24,167; Fred Kohler 23,115; Harry A. Shanley 6,840; Harry C. Smith 14,181; Edward C. Turner 39,226.

BUILDING WORK STARTS

EXCAVATION FOR FOUR-H STRUCTURES DONE

Various Gifts Are Announced by Arnold D. Collier, Club Leader; Financial Help Asked

Excavations for the new Four-H club buildings at the Lane county fairgrounds were completed yesterday and forms for the concrete foundation were placed. Pouring of concrete will take place this morning.

The cement was furnished by the Oregon Portland Cement company, Parks warehouse. The sand and gravel was furnished by the Eugene Sand and Gravel, and the concrete blocks by the Eugene Concrete Pipe company.

A gift announced by Arnold Collier, club leader, last night is the building of the fireplace in the living room of the practice house at

one end of the administration building. Robert's warehouse will install the fireplace.

On Saturday lumber will be hauled and on that afternoon all uprights for the structures will be cut and ready to put in place Monday morning. On Monday, scores of workers will gather at the fairgrounds to rush through the building work.

Financial gifts are coming into the club leader's office to assist in purchasing lumber for the buildings. More gifts are being solicited, in order that the work may be completed without a stop. Many who are unable to work on Monday have sent in wages for one day. A total of 150,000 shingles will be placed on the three buildings, all of which must be bought.

HONORS BREMEN FLIERS

MEMORIAL TABLET UNVEILED AT GREENEY ISLAND

MONTREAL, Aug. 15.—(AP)—A memorial tablet was unveiled at Greeney Island today to mark the spot where the German monoplane Bremen landed, ending the first airplane crossing of the North Atlantic from east to west.

Monsignor Levintour, bishop of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, and Archdeacon Scott, of Quebec City, spoken at the ceremony, which was attended by the inhabitants of the fishing village in the vicinity and by the lighthouse keeper and his family who were hosts to the three Bremen aviators, Baron von Huenefeld, Fitzmaurice and Koehl, during their enforced stay on the island.

The Bremen, now in Quebec City, eventually will be placed in a New York City museum.
