The Deacon's Tribulations was played at Maupin Saturday evening by the high school from here. Geo. Lofton is now employed at the Hauser & Dahl farm.

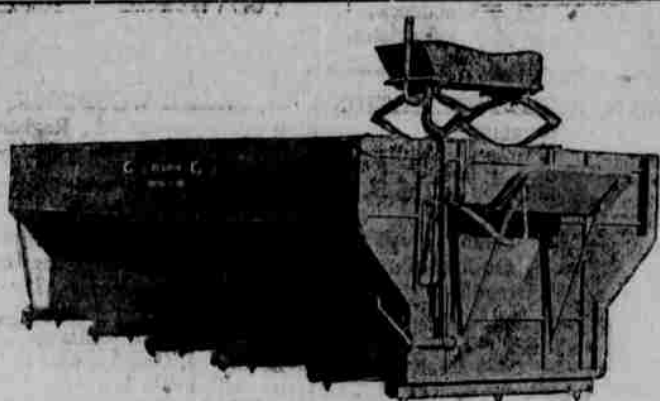
Mr. Kurta was in town last week buying hogs.
