Wapinitia Plains Commercial Club in cooperation with Director O. D. Center of O. A. C. has arranged for a days' program on August 3rd next, having for its object the training of new irrigators in the measurement of water and construction and installation of water-measure boxes, etc. The field work will be conducted by Prof. Teeter of O. A. C. Engineering Department. County Agricultural Agent Chase will assist Prof. Teeter in the field demonstration. The Commercial Club will entertain the O. A. C. members in the evening following the lecture. Everyone is invited as the day and evening meetings in field and hall are free to all. The field work will be near the Wapinitia Irrigation Co.'s, celebration ground and the lecture in the evening following at Wapinitia school house.

Nurses Wanted

So many graduate nurses are being called for U. S. army service overseas that the ranks of the nurses are greatly depleted and the Women's Council of National Defense has issued a call for 25,000 young women to join the United States Student Nurses Reserve and hold themselves in readiness to train for service as nurses.

Only those who have taken the full training course are eligible for service with the American expeditionary forces. These nurses are drawn largely from our hospitals at home. Their place must be filled by student training course of from two to three years. Every young woman who is in the United States Student Nurse Reserve is releasing a nurse for service at the front and swelling the home army which we must rely on as our second line of hospital defense. Upon the health of the American people will depend the spirit of their fighting forces.
