Co F 316 Engineers, Somewhere in France, oct. 15, 1918, My dear mother:

Well mother I have been neglect ing to write to you for some time so will try and write a line.

I have seen some pretty exciting times since I last wrote you, initia Friday We have been up on the front for several days. We were between hotel, the infantry and artillery, fixing up the road so the artillery could go shead. We were camped upon ill with the influenza, a little bill and they kept shelling it all the time. The shells were Spokane, Friday. flying about us thick as files in July. I was with the wagons all pneumonia, the time tending to the tools. We morning when a mounted police and if possible, bring her here. road just ahead of us, and while W. H.
