**OUR COMMUNITY AND ITS
NEEDS**

Several years ago the United States government established a Bureau of Children's Welfare, and set experts to work to ascertain a good many different things relating to children, number of births, percentage of deaths in infancy, rate of growth and development; in fact, everything about the lives of the children of the nation as a whole. From this ponderous mass of information it will be possible in the course of time, to deduct various facts that will tend to conserve human life and make for healthier, happier childhood, it is hoped.

By giving a greater number of children a better start in life, it follows that a great deal of the deficiency, that came so prominently before us in the recent draft can be eliminated and a correspondingly greater number of normal people can be fitted to meet life and leave a still stronger posterity to inhabit the earth.

But this is looking at things as a whole. There must be a dividing, a coming down to the state, to the community, to the individual. The national institution can cooperate with the parent; and the parent who fearlessly does his duty by raising his children in the best possible manner consistent with his circumstances, must depend to a great extent on the community, especially after the first few years of the child's life.

Physical health may be endangered by many community failings and moral health much more so. Of what use is a great, strong human animal, without a correspondingly strong mental and moral character? And here, more than any where else, is where a good, clean, intelligent, and lively community spirit and life, weigh so much in the efficient after life of the children of that particular community.

The great war just ended was met by Americans with a great cry of Liberty and Justice; with the idea that right and not might should be the governing force of the whole world. This is well and

good. The Germans and many other people need just this way of looking at things, doubtless, if the world is to be made a fit place to live in. But let's not send our ideals all across the water. Let's apply some to our own community. Let's get right down to brass tacks, be honest with ourselves. If my boy gets drunk is it all my fault? Or if he gambles after I have exhausted eloquence on deaf ears, exactly who is to blame?

Now these things are against the laws of the state. Shall we follow our own prescription of right, doing the right thing because that means following the will of the majority, as expressed in our laws, and thereby protecting our children; or will it be necessary to bring the representatives of force to compel us to do justice to our own fellow men? It isn't so idealistic as sending an army to foreign lands to compel alien people to do our will; but since we have seething sores of our own in sight, let's clean up our own back yard a while for a change.
