well having a capacity of 75,000, one is situated on the west bank of the Deschutes on the Oregon Trunk line, while the other supplies the O. W. R. & N on the east bank of the river. But already these elevators are inadequate to handle the business when the grain begins moving after harvest, and plans are under way to increase their capacity.

"We expect," said the manager of the west side elevator, "that at least 300,000 bushels of wheat will be shipped from Maupin, as a result of this year's crop. With the price at \$2 a bushel you can readily see that the farmers of this vicinity will be able to buy new automobiles this year and improve their home and land. I have never seen wheat in this section looking so well at this time of the year. It is not probable that any hot winds will affect it, as we do not suffer much in this respect. It is the late frosts that are detrimental to us, and of course we are past that danger.

Last year the crops were not so good, but two years ago over 200,000 bushels of grain were shipped from this point. Not only is Maupin a grain shipping point, but we ship many carloads of logs from here during the year. Maupin has ever reason to be proud of her growth. Nine years ago when W. H. Staats plotted the townsite and opened a little store in an old cabin formerly used by a homesteader, he had unlimited faith in Maupin's future and his confidence has never been shaken. Today there are three big general merchandise stores in

the place and Mr. Staats owns one of them. The others are conducted by Shattuck Bros. and Mrs. F. M. Jory. All do a thriving business. The Maupin State Bank is an institution that has proved a boon to the residents of that section, who before it came into existence were compelled to do their banking business in The Dalles. The Kelly hotel, constructed and now operated by L. D. Kelly on the east bank of the river, is unable to care for the many visitors who stop in the little city. It has 35 rooms, but this is not sufficient and plans are underway for expansion.

One of the finest things about Maupin is its water. Gushing forth in a cold sparkling stream from the cliffs back of the town is a giant spring, water direct from the glaciers of Mt. Hood. The spring is capable of supplying a city of many thousands.

Maupin receives much benefit from the tourists who make the trip through that part of the state when the weather conditions are favorable.
