INCREASED PRICE IN SUGAR IS STOPPED

Price Limit Placed at 10 Cents Wholesale

BY EQUALIZATION ACT

The Board Notifies Refineries Who Have Been Withholding Supplies Until Market Is Steady.

Washington, D. C .- Steps to prevent an abnormal increase in the price of sugar because of the existing shortage were taken Monday by the department

of justice. Attorney-General Palmer notified withholding their products from the market until the price situation beame stabilized, that the United States sugar equalization board had determined that 10 cents was a fair price to be charged the wholesalers and that any charge in excess of that amount would be regarded as violation of the

food control act. Refiners were asked to telegraph their concurrence in this price, which would mean that they would put their

supply on the market immediately. The price to the wholesaler heretofore has been 9 cents. Retailers have been allowed to charge 11 cents a pound for controlled sugar under the old prices. It is assumed that the new retail increase would be not greater
