## Big Drive On

The Interchurch World movement of North America swept into Wasco county in an easterly course up the Columbia basin, gripping the people everywhere with the magnitude and scope of its comprehensive plan. Wasco county laymen and ministers gathered in The Dalles Thursday, every district represented, to meet the Interchurch Instruction team traveling rapidly over the sea. Lantern description lectures and strong address also included were delivered. W. H. Wilson, Dallas attorney, is Wasco county director of the great drive, who appointed the leaders, chairmen and captains of every district from the Reservation to Mosier.

Why this great religious uplift may just now, is a fair question. What is the Interchurch movement? It was started at the time of the signing of the world war armistice in Europe, by men of vision who saw desolation, destruction and awful cheapness of life—and there they decided that it was time to start a world movement to heal, mend and restore as far as possible, what the awful carnage of 1914 had wrought. All the world energy and finance from 1914 for years was used for submarine destruction of life and property. Now comes a great world drive, a campaign for uplift and hope to a staggering world. The last week in April and first in May a great united detail financial house to house campaign will be carried to every precinct in America—which includes Wasco county. The money to be spent for relief in Europe, for school, for missions to carry the great commission "Go ye into all the world" to all people. To aid weak faith in America to kill destructive, immoral tendencies socially that our children may have a fair chance to live and grow to be decent citizens—at home. If it was worth while to support the war activities that resulted only in deplorable loss of life—how now can we gain say that should rally to support the antichurch world movement to heal the awful wounds of the world war.

Mr. and Mrs. Buran have moved the Hinton place on Shaniko road where they have a crop this year.

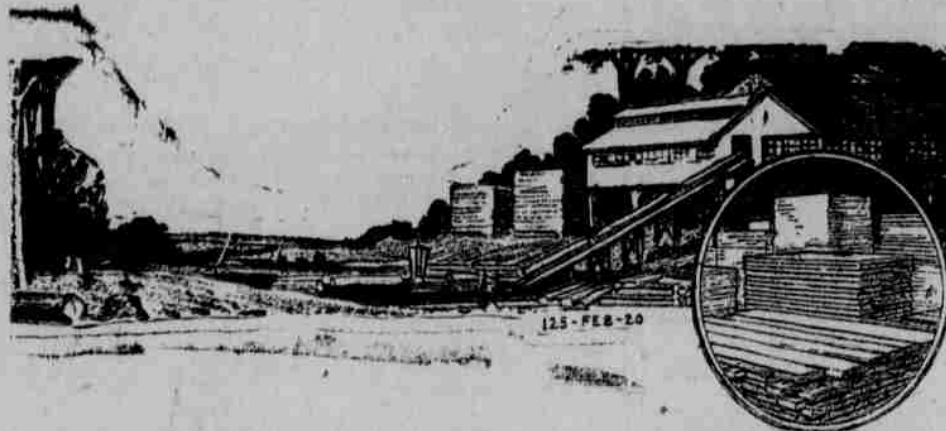
Six thoroughbred Poland China sows to let out on shares. Two old ones, one registered, four young ones.—H. A. Muller, Tygh Valley.

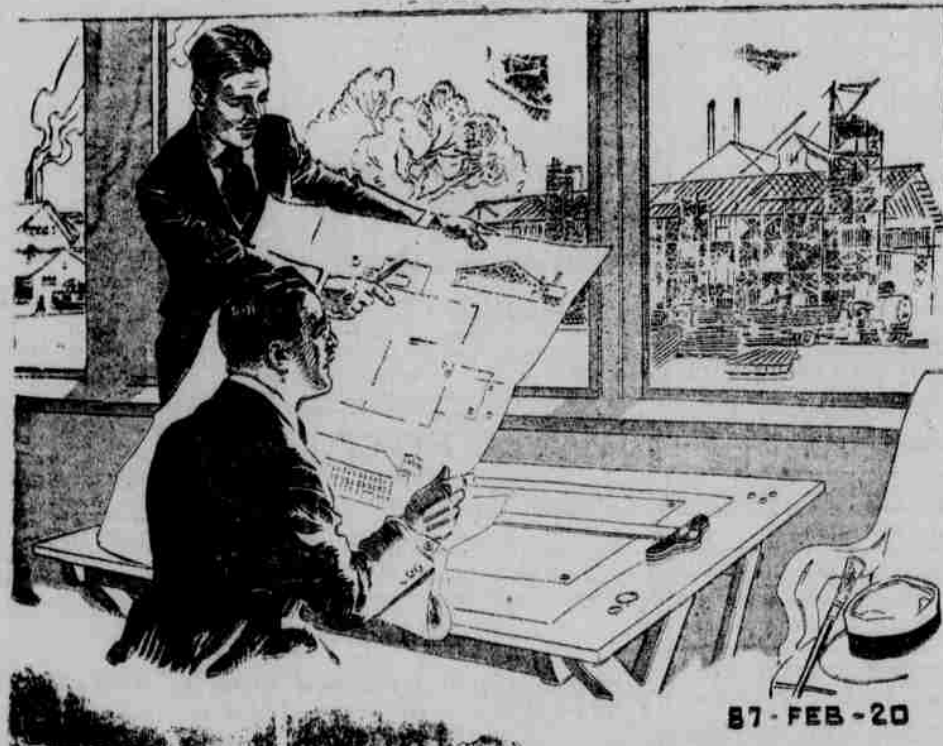
