AUGUST IMPORTS INCREASE

Germany Sends \$12,000,000 in Month Against \$236,000 Year Ago.

Washington, D. C.—The flow of goods to the United States from Europe continued to increase in August, while shipments from this country across the Atlantic decreased.

A department of commerce trade summary Tuesday showed that imports from European countries during August totaled \$114,000,000, compared with \$68,000,000 in August a year ago, while exports to Europe aggregated \$295,000,000 as against \$417,000,000 in August, 1919. Thus the trade balance for the month in favor of this country was only \$176,000,000.

Imports from Europe for the eight months ended with August were valued at \$899,000,000, compared with \$62,000,000 during the first eight months of last year, while exports in the eight months were valued at \$2,985,000,000, compared with \$3,496,000,000 during the first eight months of the year before.

Imports from South America for August aggregated \$63,000,000 compared with \$65,000,000, a year ago and for the first eight months this year \$575,000,000 as against \$387,000,000 during the same part of 1919.

Exports to the southern republics aggregated \$46,000,000 in August as against \$41,000,000 for the same months last year while for the eight months, they aggregated \$377,000,000 compared with \$305,000,000 for the same months of 1919.

Imports from Asia during the month were \$126,000,000, against \$75,000,000 in August, 1919. Exports aggregated \$47,000,000, compared with \$53,000,000 in August of last year.

Imports from Germany for the month aggregated \$12,000,000, against \$236,000 in August last year, while exports to that country aggregated \$19,000,000, compared with \$11,000,000 in August, 1919.

Imports from Great Britain aggregated \$43,000,000, compared with \$24,000,000 in August a year ago, and exports aggregated \$119,000,000, against \$204,000,000 for August, 1919.

Imports from France aggregated \$15,000,000 as against \$11,000,000 in August, 1919, and exports to that country totaled \$38,000,000 compared with \$55,000,000 in August a year ago.

Imports from Japan were \$40,000,000 in August, compared with \$34,000,000 in August a year ago, while exports to that country aggregated \$15,000,000 compared with \$24,000,000 in August, 1919.

RUSSIAN GOLD SHIPMENT MISTRUSTED

Washington, D. C.—Inquiry into the source of the recent shipment of Russian gold to the United States has been ordered by the department of justice. Belief exists at the department that the gold may be a part of the Russian bolshevik propaganda fund.

Receipt of the shipment, totaling \$339,636, was announced last week by the federal reserve board in its periodical statement on gold exports and imports. This was the first shipment of gold from Russia to the United States since late in 1916. Officials of the board said they had not yet identified the shipment or its consignee.

The federal reserve board's statement contained an item merely recording receipt of the gold from "Russia in Europe."

Federal reserve board officials suggested that the shipment might substitute one which was started in this country before America's declaration of war.

Woman, 91, Registers.

Redlands, Calif.—Mrs. I. D. Stewart celebrated her ninety-first birthday Monday by registering as a voter for the first time in her life. Her years have dulled her hearing, but she is otherwise in good health.

"What is your affiliation?" asked the clerk. "What is my affliction?" said Mrs. Stewart, and then as the question was made clear, "Oh, I'm a democrat; but I suppose you republicans would call that an affliction."
