Upon the Port of Portland has devolved the duty of providing a navigable channel up the Columbia and Willamette rivers, of building docks and other shipping facilities. The increased number and tonnage of ships require that the channel be deepened and widened and that more docks be built. For this purpose the bill enlarges the borrowing and taxing power of the commission, but taxes are to be levied and bonds and interest on them paid by taxpayers of the Port District, which is practically Multnomah County.
