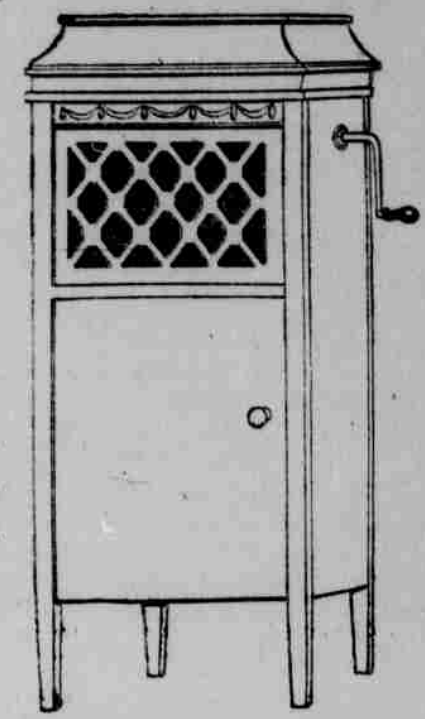
**Wamic**
