The steel steamers are both oil and coal burners. The Board has established a minimum price on these vessels.

Terms on Steel Steamers. 10 per cent of the purchase price in cash upon delivery of the vessel, 5 per cent in 6 months thereafter, 5 per cent in 12 months thereafter, 5 per cent in 18 months thereafter, balance of 20 per cent in equal semi-annual installments over a period of two years.

The two hundred and eighty-five wooden steamers for sale are of various types and sizes. Nine Daugherty seven-ton Smith ten-ton Fenimore and ten-ton American Fisheries, one Allan one Lewis and one Ocean Navigation Company (three-ton McMillan), one hundred and eighty-five other types ranging in tonnage from five to thirty tons.
