## NOTICE TO OWNERS OF PROPERTY IN WASCO COUNTY

In accordance with Chapter 127 of the General Laws of Oregon it is the duty of all owners of property infested with ground squirrels, gophers, sage rats, or other noxious rodents to eradicate such rodents by poisoning or other effective means. April 10, 1921, is hereby set as the date on or before which such poisoning must be done. Any suitable poison may be used. Poison is now available in most communities and can also be obtained from the office of the county agricultural agent.

The presence of large numbers of rodents upon any land after April 10, 1921, shall be deemed sufficient evidence that such land has not been poisoned. Persons appointed by the county court for that purpose are authorized to enter upon any property not poisoned by April 10, 1921, and poison the same. The costs of such poison and labor will be added to the taxes of the owners of such land.

An earnest appeal is made to all property owners to enter into the spirit of the law and make a sincere attempt to destroy the rodents which do thousands of dollars worth of damage every year.
