## Solid Facts No. 9

Land prepared for alfalfa when slightly sloping should be well unified or smoothed on surface; if it is flat it should be carefully leveled.

Water will overflow the corrugations and cause flooding when the surface is uneven. Hence labor and time spent in thorough preparation is good economy. The crop returns from well prepared land always exceeds roughly prepared land crops as high burned spots and low drowned spots are prevented. It is a little better to irrigate before cutting as both cutting and irrigation check growth process.

Don't allow alfalfa hay to lie unstacked too long as it becomes brittle very rapidly and the leaves and blossoms fall off causing a loss of the most valuable part. A better plan is to rake and shock and let cure afterwards. Then alfalfa should be cut just in the bloom to insure good tender hay. If alfalfa seed is to be grown following the first hay cutting no water should be put on. If alfalfa land is to be put in the fall after hay cuttings, little or no water should be put on after the last cutting. If hogs and cattle are captured on alfalfa plots in summer a division of field is recommended so one section may be irrigated and drained or dried somewhat before cattle tramp it. As a hog pasture alfalfa has no superior.
