# Solid Facts No. 9

Land prepared for alfalfa when slightly sloping should be well unified or smoothed on surface: if it is flat it should be carefully leveled.

Water will overflow the corregations and cause flooding when the surface is uneven. Hence labor and time spent in thorough preparation is good economy. The crop returns from well prepared land always exceeds roughly prepared land crops as high burned spots and low drowned spots are prevented It is a little better to irrigate before cutting as both cutting and irrigation check growth pro-
