hot winds, can seriously damage it, growers explain. A few days MAUPIN, OREGON of hot wind would cause considerable damage to spring wheat, however. The spring wheat acreage is comparatively small. Cutting will start today and tomorrow around Wamic, Cutting will start around Tygh Valley next week.

Very little advance or contract buying has been done in this county of 1921 wheat. In what few sales have been reported the contract price has been around \$1 a bushel.
