POULTRY NOTES
Sow a patch of rye near the poultry house. It will make fine forage this winter when all other green things are dead.
Eggs that are gathered often, kept cool, and are candled and graded bring better prices at the market than the "just eggs" kind.
The element of luck doesn't enter into the poultry business more largely than into any other. Ability and persistency are what count.
Scabby or scaly legs can be cured by applying a mixture of lard and kerosene twice a week for a month, Rub well in among the scales.

The poorest sandy soil is best for poultry because such land usually dries off rapidly and hence gaps, rheumatism and other germ diseases seldom appear.
Keep the poultry, as well as all other living things on the farm, on good terms with you by keeping on good terms with them.
There is mighty little money in fowls that are always kept hungry, but there is also a difference between well-fed and overfed hens.
Don't try to see how many fowls you can keep, but see how well you can keep them. Don't overcrowd your houses or yards; crowding is dangerous.

ESTIMATED 1921 APPLE CROP
Commercial Output Placed at 18,000,000 Barrels Compared With 36,000,000 Year Ago.
Federal estimate put the apple crop this year at 108,000,000 bushels as compared with 240,000,000 bushels last year and a five-year average of 102,000,000 bushels. The commercial crop for the country is estimated at 18,000,000 barrels compared with 36,000,000 barrels last year.

Prune Pear Trees Regularly.
Pear trees should be given rather regular pruning and some of the very old trees, which have huge clusters of weak spurs, can be rejuvenated rapidly by spur thinning, thinning out one-fourth to one-third of the spurs.
First-Class Fruit.
The fruit that brings the top price is first-class fruit that reaches the market in as good condition as it leaves the orchard and that is packed in a neat and attractive manner.

For Oil Stains.
To remove obstinate oil stains mix well three ounces of spirits of turpentine and one ounce of essence of lemon and apply as you would any other scouring substance.

STATE NEWS IN BRIEF.

Cove.—Foundation for the second new business house to be erected on the site of the Tripper block, burned down in the September, 1918, fire, is being laid by Lewis Bloom, pioneer grocer.

Quincy.—Celery shipping has begun earlier than usual this year and several carloads have gone out from the Lake Labish gardens this week to distant points, while a large acreage is being given special attention in anticipation of the holiday trade.

St. Helens.—The county court appointed D. W. Price of Scappoose, F. B. Holbrook of Goble and Henry Krats of Clatskanie as the budget committee to aid the court in preparing the annual budget of county expenses. They will meet with the court November 7.

Salem.—A total of 8584 ex-service men entitled to benefits under the so-called bonus law enacted at the last session of the legislature and approved by the voters at a subsequent election, have filed their applications with the world war veterans' state aid commission.

Corvallis.—Loans by the student loan fund amounting to \$3508, and applications amounting to \$1000 in addition, indicate the activity of the committee on loans for this year. In nine days following registration 27 students obtained loans. Four per cent interest is charged.

La Grande.—J. H. Pearce, recently approved for the office of receiver of the United States land office here, and Carl Helm, approved for the office of register of the same office, this morning assumed their official duties. Both received word from Washington that their bonds had been approved.

Salem.—J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools, has returned to Salem after a week passed in eastern and central Oregon attending teachers' institutes. He reported increased attendance in most of the schools and said no difficulty had been experienced this year in obtaining instructors.

Eugene.—A farmers' institute is being planned for Cottage Grove November 15, 16 and 17, according to an announcement Saturday of Ira P. Whitney, county agricultural agent, who is co-operating with E. J. Edwards of the extension division of the Oregon Agricultural college, the Cottage Grove chamber of commerce and the Eugene chamber of commerce.

Hood River.—Stanley C. Walters, chief forest ranger of the county, just back from a tour of inspection, reported that the six-mile stretch of grading on the Mount Hood loop highway on the northeast base of Mount Hood is nearing completion. Crews will break camp in the next few weeks, he said. Slashing crews, Mr. Walters said, have finished five miles through dense timber in the vicinity of Horsethief meadows.

St. Helens.—A conservative estimate of the building done and now in progress in St. Helens during the last six months is placed at \$125,000. Most of the buildings have been residences. The business houses being the new office of the Columbia River Stevedoring company, the new Spokane, Portland and Seattle depot, which cost \$15,000, and the business block of Mrs. H. F. McCormick now under construction and which will cost \$35,000.

Eugene.—The concrete pavement on the west side Pacific highway, just south of Corvallis, has been opened to traffic, affording a continuous 40-mile stretch of pavement between Eugene and Corvallis and eliminating a bad detour just out of the latter city. The opening of this pavement also furnishes a paved highway between Eugene and Portland except for the section of 12 miles between Corvallis and Albany and a mile between Barlow and Canby.

Portland.—The Brownsville woolen mills at Brownsville, Or., will resume the manufacture of woolen goods by next spring, according to present plans, and with that end in view the installation of new machinery and the overhauling of the mill is to be taken up this winter. J. L. Bowman of this city, while on a recent trip to Brownsville, assured the people of that community that the mill would be started again as soon as machinery could be obtained for a two-set mill.

Salem.—Demand will be made upon the catastrophe fund of the state industrial accident commission for the first time since the department was created as the result of an explosion at the mines of the Beaver Hill Coal company in Coos county Friday. In order to provide for such accidents the workmen's compensation act was amended in 1919 and a fund established by setting aside \$50,000, according to W. A. Marshall, chairman of the state industrial accident commission. There is now \$100,000 in the fund.
