Dance Hall Ruling

An important change has just been made by the Bureau of Internal Revenue in the tax on admission to dances.

The Regulations heretofore have held that where the admission for men was \$1.00 and women were admitted free, \$1.00 was the established price of admission and women who were admitted free were required to pay 10c tax the same as men. Where the admission price for men was 50c and for women 25c, it was held that the tax on both men and women was 5c.

By the ruling dated October 22 it is now held that women are not admitted to a dance under the same circumstances as men and that, therefore, in the case of free admission admission of women to a dance where a charge is made for admission of men such free admission shall not be taxable. Where men are charged 50c and women 25c admission the tax on men will be 5c and on women 3c. This ruling will affect so many people in the State of Oregon that I am sure your readers will be interested in any publicity that you may give to it and this office will appreciate your kind co-operation in the
