### Obituary

Albert McClure was born June 2, 1861, at Albany, Oregon, coming to Eastern Oregon when 13 years of age, where he has resided since. He was married to Lizzie Dean, June 23, 1884 who died June 23, 1886. In 1903 he was married to Miss Mary Williams of this place, who died May 18, 1908. One son John William McClure, survives. Mr. McClure died at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon from illness due to a stroke of paralysis. He was one of the mercantile firm of Williams and McClure of this place, and before the central Oregon railroads were established used to carry mail between Wapinitia and The Dalles. Funeral services are being conducted this afternoon, and interment made in the Kelly cemetery near Wapinitia.

Mrs. Katrina Weber, for the past twenty years a resident of this part of the country, died this morning at 6:40 of heart trouble. Mrs. Weber was born in Germany and came to this country when young, being 59 years of age. She has lived for the past 17 years at the family home on Juniper Flat and with her daughter, of Tygh, Mrs. K. L. Hauser. Mr. Weber died two years ago, since which time the family have lived at the Hauser home. Mrs. Weber was a member of the Lutheran church and the mother of eight children six of whom are living, namely, Mrs. K. L. Hauser of Tygh Valley, Mrs. Lewis Walters, Wapinitia, Mrs. Katie Clark of Dufur, and Alta, Freddie and Willie Weber, of Tygh Valley. Funeral was held this afternoon at Wapinitia.

Mrs. Emily Hamblet died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Stella McMurry, in Wamic March 29th. She was born in New York August 23 1833. At the time of her death she was 88 yrs 7 months and 6 days old. In 1852 she was united in marriage to Alford Hamblet. Soon after their marriage they moved to Iowa where they lived for many years. Later they resided in Nebraska. From there they moved to Portland Oregon in December 1912. Mr. Hamblet died in 1913. With her daughter and family Mrs. Hamblet came to Wamic in 1914. She is survived by five children, 30 grandchildren, 25 great grand children and one great great grand child.

Early in life Mrs. Hamblet became a Christian and was identified with the Baptist Church. Through out her many years she continued to love and serve her
