Farmer Smith, of O. W. R. & N. has stated that Texas buyer alone will be glad to contract seed potatoes up to 3000 cars or more if we get busy and raise them.

The Libby McNeil and Libby plant at The Dalles wants all the fruit and vegetables that Wasco County can produce. They get less than one fourth of their requirements from local production. The King Dehydrating plant and the Libby Cannery ship thousands of dollars worth of produce from Yakima and other project points. What is the matter with Wapinitia Plain? Oh! you say you can't get your stuff to them. No you can't when it means a trip with one cabbage, two melons, and one dozen eggs but we have a district where 1000 to 10,000 acres can be put out in potatoes, cucumbers, melons, alfalfa, squash and the many kindred varieties. Truck loads to Maupin and direct will carry these to good market, with 400 good dairy cows a creamery can be insured at Wapinitia or Maupin. This is live work for the Farmer's Union and the Maupin and Wapinitia Commercial Club to arouse the farmers to action. And let us be fair enough and broad enough to accept the fact that the fellow 10 miles away does not necessarily possess horns just because he is on the other side of the fence politically, religiously or in trade choice. Lets fight the outside world if we must fight but let Maupin, Wapinitia, Victor, Pine Grove, Tygh Valley and all wasco points pull for the common good that the county and district may develop in the things that the Creator has placed unto reach. Land subdivision agencies are practicing this smaller farm unit idea all over the west.

Through right methods we can get co-operation from R. R. agents commercial clubs in the East, our county and state chambers and if we select a live slogan and all about it, the folks will hear it as far as the two cent stamp will carry first class mail and the thing is solved when we see the vision.
