Oregon Woman Fights Typhoid Saves 1000 Children and Runs Special Trains.

"My life has been so hum-drum and is nothing has happened to me out of the ordinary I am sure there is noth ing in what I have done the last two years in the Near East that would be of interest to my Oregon friends," stat ed Mrs. Amy Authony Burt of Bond Oregon, to J. J. Handsaker, State Director of the Near East Relief when he met her in Constantinople las

"After much effort," says Mr. Hand alter, "I persuaded her to tell me some of the things of this hum-drum life of hers. Sitting in a Constantinople cof fee-house she told me of some of the events of her life since March 1919. when she arrived in the Near East."

'Her first work was at Karakliss where with her sister, Miss Gertrud Anthony, she had charge of a large orphanage and a territory 75 miles square for general relief. During the time she was there she nursed her sis ter through both typhold and typhus The two women were alone in this sta

After going through this experience they went to Alexandropol and there one day received a message from the Baku, some 500 miles away. British had been feeding about 1,000 children, and unless they were trans ferred immediately they would starve as soon as the British left. This Gregor woman whose life was so bum drun quietly secured two special trains, put ting a man in charge of one, and taking the other herself. On arriving at Baku, she began leading the children at 10 o'clock a. m. and had the children and their supplies all aboard by 6:30 p. m. She read the riot act to the Turkish captain in charge of the train and he compelled the guards to cease attempting to enter the cars where the older girls and wemen were. The round trip took nearly two weeks, but Mrs. fort returned to Alexandropol with ber two train loads of children without

baving lost a single child. "We simply must ignore the rest. she writes "Just outside our gate there are scores of starving children lying or sitting about listlessly, shiver ing in filthy rage, with their littl sones fairly protruding through thei skins. Many of them are sick and is pain, and they all beg piteously to be taken in every time they can catch th attention of any of the workers. Many until it cannot be done again, else there would not be food enough for the ones we already have. Another awful thing one may see any day, ar the little quiet bundles of rags lying on the sunny side of a wall or a hill side, just able to stir feebly now and then, or to lift up pleading little wist ful arms in supplication, if anyonpasses. They will lie in the same spot for days sometimes, before they be come quite atill. Then the Soviet cart with its daily load of the dead, come and picks up the little bundle. Just picture any one of the many mothers in this tragic land-half-starved and despairing, clad in regs and tatters with her naked habe in her arms, the little thing trying teebly to draw nour ishment from her dried-up breasts I must not write of it, nor think o We must all keep strong for the work that is before us, and think only of the great good that we are doing But I beg of you, never believe that there can be any exaggoration in the stories you hear of the sufferings an
