With in a week alter she asked me this question, has own little boy was stricken and died. One week after the lad was buried. I returned to Con stantinople, from the interior, to find Mrs. Emrich again at her post, with the ante-room of her office filled with widows and orphans to whom she was giving careful sympathetic attention.
