FIRST DAY

1/2 mile Free for all Purse \$100.00
1/2 mile Saddle horse race " 50.00
1/2 mile Pony race 14 hand or under " 25.00
1/2 mile Relay race—each day " 75.00
String winning two heats in the three days gets \$50.00; second string \$25.00.

SECOND DAY

1/2 mile Free for all Purse \$100.00
1/2 mile Saddle horse race " 50.00
1/2 mile Pony race 14 1/2 hands and under " 35.00
1/2 mile Double rider race " 25.00
Second heat of relay race

THIRD DAY

1/2 mile Free for all Purse \$150.00
1/2 mile Saddle horse race " 75.00
1/2 mile Pony race boys 14 yrs or under " 25.00
Squaw race 1/2 mile " 15.00

Third heat of relay race
1/2 mile race for non-winners Purse 50.00

All races but relay race purses divided 70-20-10. Ten per cent to enter, four to enter and three to start.
All horses must be entered day or night before races.
A saddle horse is a horse that has never won public money.
