## Notice to Water Users on Deschutes River

To all persons, firms and corporations, claiming a right to the use of the waters of the Deschutes river or a tributary thereof; and

To All Whom It May Concern:

You and each of you are hereby notified that the State Engineer of Oregon will commence the taking of testimony as to the rights of all parties claiming rights to the use of the waters

of the above named stream or any tributary thereof, as follows:

On Tuesday, the 6th day of November, 1923, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at The Dalles, Oregon;

On Wednesday, the 7th day of November, 1923, at the City Hall in Maupin, Oregon;

On Thursday, the 8th day of November, 1923, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Madras, Oregon;

On Friday and Saturday, the 9th and 10th days of November, 1923, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Bend, Oregon;

And for a period of 30 days, beginning November 14th, 1923, at the office of the State Engineer in the Capitol Building at Salem, Oregon.

Statements and proofs of claim of the various claimants will be taken at said times and places from 9 A. M. to 12 M. and from 1 P. M. to 4 P. M.

AND YOU ARE HEREBY REQUIRED TO APPEAR at one of the times and places above named and submit proof of your claim to the use of the waters of said stream or a tributary thereof, if any such right is claimed by you; and you are hereby further notified that if you fail to so appear and submit proof of your claim to said water, default will be entered against you and you will be barred and stopped from subsequently asserting any right to the use of said waters, and will be held and deemed to have forfeited all right to the use of said waters theretofore claimed by you.
