THE TALISMAN

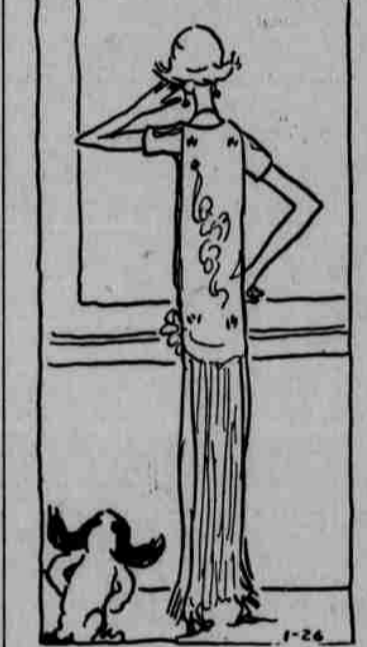

GOOD EATS FOR THE FAMILY

A NY fresh fish may be baked in the following manner; but halibut is especially good: Baked Halibut. Arrange six slices of salt pork in a dripping pan.

Cheese Sandwiches. These are nice with a cup of tea or as a supper dish. Cut stale bread in one-quarter-inch slices, spread with butter and sprinkle with salt and cayenne.

Oyster Croquettes. Strain the juice from a pint of oysters, cut the oysters fine and return to the liquor, add two beaten eggs, one teaspoonful of salt, a dash of cayenne, and enough cracker crumbs to mix into croquettes.

STATE NEWS IN BRIEF.

Baker.—A silver gray fox farm is the latest enterprise to be launched in Baker valley, plans for which are now definitely arranged.

Hillsboro.—J. T. Young of this city has received a 55-year Oddfellow Jewel, having been a member of the lodge for more than 55 years.

Grants Pass.—The Tokay grape crop of the Grants Pass district again is moving, after having been held up by the rain for several weeks.

Toledo.—During the last week two timber deals in the Siletz district of this county were consummated, totaling an exchange of \$94,000 for about 1000 acres of excellent fir and spruce.

Sheridan.—A large cash land deal that forecast important timber development was completed this week in the transfer of 244 acres of stock and timber land to D. C. Kirby, local mill operator.

John Day.—Mount Vernon vicinity is astir since the burning of the Range schoolhouse, which is the second structure to be destroyed there in the past year.

Salem.—In an effort to prevent the spread of diphtheria in the Englewood district, cultures of throats of all pupils and teachers in the schools there will be taken this week by local health authorities.

Salem.—H. S. Gille & Co. has received an order for 500 cases of evaporated prunes from Calcutta, India. These prunes will be packed in 2 1/2-pound cans and labeled with the Hunter brand of the Willamette Valley Prune association.

Grants Pass.—The Oregon caves resort has been closed for the season. It will open again May 15. The entire staff has been withdrawn and the lodge boarded up to withstand the snows of this winter.

Hood River.—The crews of the Gilpin Construction company, engaged on the Interstate bridge over the Columbia here, have made rapid headway the last week because of the fine weather.

Corvallis.—Dr. M. A. Jull, senior poultry husbandman, bureau of animal industry, Washington, D. C., inspected the college poultry department Friday. Three Barred Plymouth Rock male birds were selected from the college flock by Dr. Jull to be sent to the government poultry farm at Beltsville, Md., where they will be used in government breeding experiments.

Portland.—Portland's new million-dollar Elks' temple is rapidly nearing completion and tentative plans have been made to move the personal effects of Portland lodge, No. 142, and to dedicate the new temple.

Pendleton.—Approximately \$230,000 of county money has been spent in Umatilla county this year for the construction of new market roads and the repair and maintenance of roads and county bridges.

Hermiston.—H. A. Scullen, secretary of the State Beekeeper's association, has announced the dates for the Oregon meeting as December 11 and 12. The dates were chosen in order to conform with the schedule of the committee of the American Honey Producers' league.
