EXEMPTIONS:

Married persons \$2000.00 Single persons \$1000.00 RATES:

One percent on the first \$1000.00 above exemptions, rate raises 1-4 percent on each additional \$1000.00 to 2 percent; then raises 1-2 percent on each additional \$1000.00 to a maximum of 6 percent on all incomes of \$12,000.00 or more.

TAX EXEMPT SECURITIES: All U.S. Securities exempt, State Securities not exempt. All dividends are subject to tax.

DATE FOR FILING RETURNS: Returns for 1923 must be filed on or before March 30th, 1924.
