IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE RELATIVE RIGHTS TO THE USE OF THE WATERS OF DESCHUTES RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER.

TO Each and Every Claimant to the use of Water from Deschutes River or any tributary thereof:

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON: You are hereby notified that all statements and proofs of claim and other evidence heretofore submitted by the various claimants to the use of the waters of Deschutes River and its tributaries WILL BE OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION as follows:

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, the 25th, 26th and 27th days of February, 1924, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Bend, Oregon
On Thursday, the 28th day of February, 1924, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Madras, Oregon.

On Friday, the 29th day of February, 1924, at the Bank in Maupin, Oregon.

And for a period of 30 days beginning with Monday, the 3rd day of March, 1924, and ending with Tuesday, the 1st day of April, 1924, at the office of the State Engineer in the Capitol Building, Salem, Oregon.

AND YOU ARE HEREBY FURTHER NOTIFIED that the final decrees entered in the matters of the determination of the relative rights to the use of the waters of White River, Trout Creek, Crooked River, Squaw Creek, Tumalo Creek, and Paulina Lake & Creek, fixing and determining the relative rights to the use of the waters of said streams, as between the parties thereto, will also be open to public inspection at the times and places above designated.
