An ORDINANCE to provide for the issuance of the Town of Maupin Water Bonds in the suni of twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$12,500); to provide a form for said bonds and the coupons attached thereto; ratifying, approving and confirming the sale of said bonds and declaring an emergency.
