Notice Of Game And Fish Stream And Lake Closing

Notice is hereby given that by an order duly and regularly made by the State Game Commission of the State of Oregon on the 11th day of January, 1926, it was found and determined that the supply of trout and fish of all kinds is being, and will be, injuriously affected by permitting the same to be taken during the periods of time hereinafter specified from the streams, lakes and waters hereinafter named, and that during the period of time beginning on the 15th day of April, 1926, and ending on the 15th day of April, 1927, both dates inclusive, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill, angle for, take or have in his possession, any species of trout or other fish of any kind or species from the following described streams, lakes and waters of the State of Oregon, to-wit:

All that part of the Willamette River, beginning at a point on Black Point at the west corner of the Hawley Paper and Pulp Company's Electric Station, situated on the east bank of said Willamette River, in Clackamas County, Oregon, thence running in a westerly direction across said Willamette River to a point on the Island in line with the east corner of the Crown Willamette Paper Company's Pulp mill situated on the west side of said River; thence in a southerly direction to the deadline established by an act of the State Legislature, 200 feet below the fishway over the Willamette Falls in said River; thence following said deadline across said River to the east bank of said River; thence in a northerly direction to the place of beginning at the west corner of the Hawley Paper & Pulp Company's Electric Station located on Black Point.

All that part of the Willamette River known as the Tail Race of the Crown Willamette Paper Company, situated in Clackamas County, Oregon, beginning at a point at the mouth of said Tail Race on the south bank thereof, thence extending directly across said Tail Race to the north bank thereof; thence in a westerly, southerly and easterly direction around the bank of said Tail Race to the place of beginning.

Blue Lake, situated in Lake County, Oregon.
And that said streams, lakes and waters be, and are closed, to fishing with hook and line, commonly known as angling, for and during the period of time above specified.

Notice is hereby given that by an order duly and regularly made by the State Game Commission of the State of Oregon on the 11th day of January, 1926, it was found and determined that the supply of trout and game fish of all kinds is being, and will be, injuriously affected by permitting the same to be taken during the periods of time hereinafter specified from the Lakes and waters hereinafter named, and that during the period of time beginning on the 15th day of April, 1926, and ending on the 15th day of April, 1929, both dates inclusive, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill, angle for, take or have in possession, any species of trout or other game fish of any kind or species from the following described Lakes and waters of the State of Oregon, to-wit:

Douglas County—Twin lakes.
Jefferson County—Warren lake, Upper lake, Cigar lake, Matt lake, Cap lake, Rough lake, Horseshoe lake, Timber lake, Top lake and View lake, Lake creek.
Klamath County—Fish lake and Maidu lake.
Lane County—Spring lake, Benson lake, Tenas lake, Campers lake, Hand lake, Linnton

lake, Leach lake, Moonlight lake, McLakwa lake, Boulder lake, Trim lake, Tipton lake, Round lake, Little lake, Husband lake, Point lake, Cliff lake, Jane lake, Glaze lake and Island lake.

Linn County—Indian Prairie lake.

Marion County—Jude lake, Brook lake, Head lake, First lake, Clifford lake, Middle lake, Finley lake, Triangle lake, Sigh lake, Sheep lake, Wall lake, Av-erill lake.

Wallowa County—Frances lake, Wood lake, Swamp lake, Hobo lake, Lilly lake, Maxwell lake.

Wasco County—Frog lake and Boulder lake.
And that said lakes and waters be, and are closed, to fishing with hook and line, commonly known as angling, for and during the period of time above specified.

Notice Of Game Fish Stream And Lake Closing

Notice is hereby given that by an order duly and regularly made by the State Game Commission of the State of Oregon on the 11th day of January, 1926, it was found and determined that the supply of trout and fish of all kinds is being, and will be, injuriously affected by permitting the same to be taken during the periods of time hereinafter specified from the streams, lakes and waters hereinafter named, and that during the period of time beginning on the 15th day of April, 1926, and ending on the 15th day of April, 1936, both dates inclusive, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill, angle for, take or have in possession, except as hereinafter specified, any species of trout or other fish of any kind or species from the following described streams, lakes and waters of the State of Oregon, to-wit:

Baker County—Crawfish lake, Rock Creek lake, Black lake, Anthony lake, Grande Ronde lake, Mud lake, and Van Patton lake, closed from October 1 to June 15th of each year. Goose creek, Balm creek, Big creek, Wolfe creek, Deer creek, McCully creek, Elk creek, Anthony creek, tributaries of Powder River, closed from August 15 to April 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Deschutes County—Elk lake, East lake, Twin lakes, Lava lake, Little Lava lake, Three Greek lake and Paulina lake, closed from September 10 to April 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Grant County—Strawberry lake, Magoon lake, Olive lake, Lake Creek Reservoir and Lake creek, closed from April 15 to June 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Hood River County—East Fork of Hood River above its junction with the West Fork of Hood River; Middle Fork of Hood River above its junction with the East Fork of Hood River; West Fork of Hood River above its junction with the East Fork of Hood River, together with all tributaries thereof, closed from November 30 to June 1 of each year, both dates inclusive. Lost Lake Branch creek closed from November 30 to June 1 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Klamath County—Seven Mile creek closed to June 15 of each year. Wood River and tributaries closed to June 15th of each year. Klamath River for a distance of 4000 feet below and 2000 feet above the mouth of Spitzer creek, closed to June 15 of each year.

Lake County—Campbell lake and Dead Horse lake closed from September 1 to July 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Polk County—The South Fork of the Siletz River from the dam owned by the Cobb & Mitchell

Lumber Company, including the mill pond above said Dam, and Handy creek, Sand creek and Beaver creek, closed from July 15th to April 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Union County—Ladd creek closed from November 30 to July 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

Wallowa County—Wallowa lake and tributary streams closed to taking of "Yanka," Landlocked Salmon or Redfish with yankhook and jerkhook. These fish to be taken with hook and line, commonly called angling, only. Aneroid lake closed from September 15 to April 15 of each year, both dates inclusive.

And that said streams, lakes and waters be, and are closed, to fishing with hook and line, commonly known as angling, for and during the periods of time above specified.
