Oregon News Notes

Klamath Falls—Ice and cold storage plant to cost \$30,000 well under way.

Grants Pass—Golden Mary Mine, with \$600,000 improvements and 100-ton mill, is ready to run on 25,000 tons of \$15 ore already blocked out.

Salem—First fabrics woven in new \$600,000 linen mills.

VACATION MILITARY TRAINING

Wasco's Allotment Will Be Six—Held at Vancouver Barracks

Active preparations for the Citizens' Military Training camp for infantry to be held at Vancouver barracks from June 17 to July 16 are under way at the present time and a complete tent camp, equipped with showers, bath houses, kitchens and mess halls will be in place ready for

the 375 boys who are expected to take advantage of the opportunity for military and citizenship training during the vacation months.

The camp is open to boys between the ages of 17 and 24 inclusive, for the basic course. Expense of going to camp and returning home will be paid by the government, and each boy will be furnished with a uniform, food and shelter, free of charge, while at camp.

Places have been reserved for six boys from Wasco county.

No obligation for future service in any component of the United States army attaches to attendance at Citizens' military training camps.

Saving Wild Life

A national movement is being organized asking motorists to cooperate in saving the lives of birds and wild animals on the highway.

The annual toll of wild birds, domestic fowl, squirrels, rabbits and other wild life from death, by motor cars is tremendous. The need for great care is obvious. Save Your Old Roads

Macadam and gravel roads have an actual money value because they will serve as foundations for road surfaces equal to that of Fifth Avenue, New York. The salvage value of old macadam and gravel roads should not be disregarded.

In an 18-foot wide macadam road six inches thick there are 3,000 cubic yards or about 65 carloads of stone which may be worth anywhere from \$4,500 to \$9,000, depending upon the local price of stone.

This great quantity of stone has been moved from the quarry to the road, spread and compacted, representing probably further investment of at least \$6,000. Traffic has compacted it far better than it is possible by any mechanical process, and in tearing it out this work of years is undone.

Time and traffic have shown up the weak spots, and these can be repaired by adding new stone without disturbing the old compact portions.
